Florida Coastal School of Law (FCSL) was founded upon and is dedicated to the proposition that your future is our first and foremost priority. ■ Our Students

Student-centeredness, multiculturalism as a norm, and a partnered learning experience that effectively prepares you to meet the challenges of an increasingly competitive world are the cornerstones of your educational experience here. Teaching, mentoring, networking, and getting to know you personally and professionally are responsibilities we take seriously. Multiculturalism as a norm means that diversity is not just our future, it is now. Particularly against the backdrop of modern societal and global realities, multicultural functionality cannot be a mere aspiration. Effective interaction with and appreciation of diverse experiences and lives are essential prerequisites for high achievement both personally and professionally.

■ FCSL's Learning Partnership

A learning partnership means working closely inside and outside the classroom with faculty members who are

committed to sharing their expertise, experience, and networks; are eager to learn from your life experience; and aim to develop synergies on the basis of shared opportunity and mutual respect. These qualities are among those that have distinguished FCSL as a law school that takes your aspirations seriously. We believe that our supportive learning environment makes a difference in your educational experience, personal growth, and professional functioning. Our students, more than anyone, can attest to the fact that our words and promises are not empty rhetoric. ■ Faculty

The faculty includes not only outstanding legal scholars, but also former judges, trial attorneys, government officials, and corporate leaders who interact with students on a daily basis and bring a practical perspective to the learning process. The vast majority of the faculty at FCSL have at least a decade of practical experience in their respective fields of expertise. We consider this an essential factor in developing well-rounded graduates capable of meeting the challenges of the twenty-first century.

■ Curriculum

The infusion curriculum is a program that brings professional responsibility, ethics, values, skills training, multiculturalism, and internationalism into all first-year and some advanced courses as a part of the pedagogical process. Through the use of role-playing, simulations, special problems, and multidiscipline presentations, students directly experience the lawyering process, observe the interaction of law with other disciplines, and acquire an appreciation for the relationship of law to the client, the court, and the community.

■ Center for Law and Sports

Florida Coastal School of Law established the Center for Law and Sports in 2005. The center offers students a comprehensive sports law curriculum in which to obtain a certificate in sports law and concentrate their legal studies on the rapidly changing and dynamic sports industry. A variety of unique and specialized course offerings are taught by three dedicated full-time sports law faculty members, as well as adjunct faculty employed in the sports industry. Students enrolled in the certificate program may also have the unique opportunity to participate in an internship with a sports organization or university athletic department. The law school also participates annually in a national sports law moot court competition.

There is a collective body of specific areas of the law (for example, antitrust law, labor law, tort law, constitutional law, intellectual property law, and contract law) that apply within the business of sports. Lawyers working in the sports industry, whether at the amateur or professional level, must be well-versed as to how different areas of the law come together and apply to various legal and business issues confronted on a daily basis. The center is dedicated to preparing students to handle these challenges, and to serving as a local and national

resource for sports industry attorneys and professionals, sports law academics, and the media.

■ Closing Invitation from the Dean

Florida Coastal School of Law has been described as “the most exciting experiment in American legal education.” This description reflects a growing sense of enthusiasm within legal education and the legal profession for our institution’s unique attributes. Foremost among these is the proposition that students are our overarching priority.

Florida Coastal School of Law was founded upon and is defined by the premise that students are the axis upon which our school turns. This originating premise differentiates us from institutions where other priorities make faculty remote from and inaccessible, or even indifferent, to students. FCSL has its share of distinguished and prolific scholars. The entire faculty is composed, however, of persons with extensive experience in the real world of lawyering who consciously have rejected an ivory-tower existence. They have a common commitment and the know-how to provide a legal education that enables you to hit the ground running as a lawyer when you graduate.
